New Zealand Women's Championship 2005

This year's New Zealand Women's Championship shaped up as one of the most intriguing for some years.

Twelve players contested the Championship proper, while another eight played in the separate Reserve Championship.

On paper fifteen year-old Evguenia Charomova deserved to be the clear favourite. At 1699, she was rated more than a hundred points ahead of her nearest rival, fellow Olympiad representative Sue Maroroa.

For the past two years, Charomova had led the

Championship going into final round, only to stumble at the final hurdle.

Defending champion Viv Smith was only seeded third this time, after some disappointing results in the previous rating period saw her rating tumble to 1513.

Smith, the winner of ten Championships, was the only player representing the older generation. The other eleven players were all in their teens, products of the effort

NZCF has put in over

the past five years to promote female chess. Aside from Charomova, Maroroa and Smith other leading contenders were female Grand Prix leader Eachen Chen and World Youth reps Shirley Wu and Natasha Fairley. The field also included two visitors from Christchurch, Tabitha Lau and Manu Somerville.

The big question was: would this be the year youth triumphed, or would Smith stave off the inevitable for yet another twelve months?

Round One

Smith had the easiest start, with Somerville blundering several pieces.

Charomova played a good consistent game against Lau, demonstrating the power of a good knight against a miserable bishop.

Maroroa sacrificed a piece for two pawns and the initiative; it may not have been quite sound, but Judy Gao was unable to cope with the complications.

Fairley had an early stumble, conceding a draw to Sharon Wu. Wu lost a pawn in the opening but fought back well, opening up white's king-side and regaining the pawn with a better position. In the end Fairley was happy

to salvage a draw.
Shirley Wu was probably also happy with a draw, after Cecily Liu built up an overwhelming advantage and missed the win of a pawn.

The strangest game of the round was Eachen Chen's win over Catherine Jiang. Chen appeared to have played an excellent positional game, after saddling Jiang with an isolated pawn and carrying out some serious manoeuvring. It was only after the game that it was discovered that Chen had gained

an important tempo by leaving her king in check!

Round Two

Charomova played another good game, against Chen. Black defended tenaciously but white always had more space and activity and went on to win the rook and pawn ending.

Smith achieved a clearly won position against Maroroa but then proceeded to make very heavy work of it, eventually swapping into an ending a pawn up — which Maroroa could have drawn! However the saving line was a little tricky and Maroroa was unable to find it.

Sharon Wu and Liu drew in a game of fluctu-

ating fortunes. Liu played a dubious equalising exchange in the opening and white missed a chance to win a pawn. Later Wu got her bishop trapped but Liu's exposed king with queens on the board made a draw a fair outcome.

Lau learnt the drawbacks of playing with no plan against Jiang. Black's queen became misplaced and a target of white's attack. White overlooked a tactic that would have won a rook, but her advantage was still enough to win.

Gao scored an easy victory after a series of serious errors by Somerville.

The tragi-comic game of the round was Shirley Wu against Fairley. Fairley's lack of book knowledge was exposed in the exchange Ruy Lopez, but Wu did not take advantage. Wu then overlooked the loss of an exchange and then another pawn. The position was easily won for Fairley when she inexplicably left her rook en prise on move 51. The game then transposed into that dreaded endgame – bishop, knight and king against king – but Wu made the checkmate look easy.

Round Three

Smith had white for the crunch game against Charomova. Opening preparation went well and she won a pawn. With the right continuation at least one more pawn was doomed and she would have been on the way to a key victory. However an aimless check and then some indecisiveness combined with time trouble to make things far from clear. Charomova missed a few chances to stir up trouble and eventually swapped into a lost ending an exchange down. But a tired Smith took the wrong pawn and allowed a draw; a different capture would have been an easy win. The tension of this game can be judged by the fact that neither player was able to keep a decipherable score - hence it is unfortunately missing from the selected games. Maroroa and Shirley Wu also drew - in just 13 moves. Fairley versus Jiang was another draw, when Jiang recovered from a lost position to reach a bishop and wrong rook's pawn. Liu capitalised on a dubious opening by Gao to win a pawn and reach an easily won bishop ending. Chen was another winner, although Sharon Wu

missed a drawing chance a pawn down in a rook ending. Lau scored her first win, against Somerville, who was now starting to look seriously outclassed.

Leaders: Charomova, Smith 2.5; Shirley Wu, Chen, Liu 2, Maroroa, Jiang 1.5.

Round Four

Charomova beat Liu after the latter created her own weaknesses and was soon unable to protect a backward pawn.

Smith agreed a draw with Shirley Wu after just 15 moves, deciding she didn't like her position. Maroroa got a big opening advantage against Chen but then blundered a piece. She threw the kitchen sink into a desperate attack and fortune smiled when Chen missed a chance to swap off. The attack then proved good enough for a draw. Sharon Wu and Tabitha Lau also drew, after Wu generated some activity for a lost pawn and perhaps wisely accepted a draw on move 23.Gao beat Jiang after the latter overloaded her queen and lost a piece. Fairley had an easy win over Somerville.

Leaders: Charomova 3.5, Smith 3, Shirley Wu, Chen 2.5, Maroroa, Fairley, Gao, Liu 2.

Round Five

The Charomova juggernaut rolled on, with a little help from Shirley Wu, who lost a piece to a fork on move 11. Smith stayed just behind. after a steady endgame win over Chen. Maroroa scored a typically sharp victory in just 17 moves, with Lau unable to cope with black's aggressive play. Gao outplayed Fairley comprehensively, centralising her pieces well and taking advantage of black's wasted moves. With a rook trapped in the corner, it was soon all over. Jiang beat Sharon Wu after black created and then lost a weak e-pawn, followed by a knight. Liu had the easy game of the round, with Somerville giving a piece on move 6. Leaders: Charomova 4.5, Smith 4, Maroroa, Gao, Liu 3, Shirley Wu, Chen, Jiang 2.5.

Round Six

Another win for Charomova, but this time not

quite so easily. Maroroa seriously complicated the game; both players could have been winning or losing at various stages. Maroroa could then have accepted a forced draw by repetition, but preferred to give back an extra rook to reach M. Somerville (0) 12. an ending. Unfortunately the resulting position favoured Charomova.

Smith dropped another draw, this time against Liu, who offered a peace pact after reaching a slightly better endgame.

Gao-Chen was also drawn, in a rook ending. Chen won a pawn but drifted into a probably lost position. Fortunately for her Gao chose to protect her own pawns rather than attack. There was no sisterly love in Sharon versus Shirley Wu, where black won a pawn and then swapped into a winning queen ending. Jiang easily beat Somerville, who failed to develop and then overlooked a fork.

Fairley beat Lau when the latter's pieces became tangled in a cramped position. Leaders: Charomova 5.5, Smith 4.5, Shirley Wu, Gao, Jiang 3.5.

With at least first equal assured Charomova was

free to just play in the final round. The pundits gave Gao little chance, but she put up a great fight. In a complex position she might have drawn with 39...Qa2+ and ...Qc4, but failed to find the right plan and Charomova's pieces infiltrated to force the win. Smith meanwhile agreed a draw in 17 moves with Jiang to ensure herself clear second and immediately regretted it. Post-game analysis showed she was clearly winning. Shirley Wu moved up to third after a series of serious mistakes by Somerville. Liu also took advantage of a Christchurch visitor to join Wu in third place, although her win over Lau was much tougher. Maroroa made the most of a disappointing tour-

Conclusion:

There are always twists and turns in any tournament, but there can be no argument that Charomova was the deserved winner of her first New Zealand Women's Championship. Evguenia had one lucky escape – from a lost position against Smith - but overall her play was impressive. She showed the ability to swap to winning endgames and win them, and also coped well in sharp, complex positions. Her victory automatically earned Evguenia a place in next year's NZ Women's Olympiad team. Runner-up Viv Smith did not lose a game, but seemed to lack energy. However, her solid performance (three wins and four draws) shows that she is still one of our most consistent female players.

Tied for third were Shirley Wu and Cecily Liu. Wu finished fourth equal last year, so continues her improvement. However she had a number of dubious positions and was especially fortunate to be gifted a rook by Fairley. It seems clear that some opening study may soon be required. Liu's placing confirmed her ability. She achieved some excellent positions but often had difficulty "closing them out". More self belief and some middlegame study could help her improve further.

Second seed Maroroa would have to be disappointed with her 4 points. Her aggressive and confident play gains her many victories, but at the same time it can sometimes prove costly e.g. against Chen. However Maroroa could still have shared third if she had taken the forced draw against Charomova. Sue has clearly improved and now perhaps just needs to add a dose of circumspection and a little more patience to her play.

Eachen Chen also finished on four points. This was another steady effort from a player who has tering her king-side and taking full advantage of improved markedly over the past year. She lost only two games – to Charomova and Smith. It

may soon be time to add a few sharper lines to her opening repertoire.

The third player sharing 5th place was Catherine Lin Zou 1. Jiang. This was a very good result from a player with little experience in serious tournaments, and showed that Catherine has potential. If she sticks at it, there is no reason she could not be in contention for the national team within a few

Judy Gao finished eighth on three and half points. This was a good result from a promising player. Judy's play seemed to get stronger as the tournament progressed and she showed that she has great potential. Her victims included Fairley and Jiang.

Natasha Fairley was seeded fourth but finished a disappointing ninth. She let herself down in this tournament with some serious oversights, notably against Shirley Wu. But she has shown what she is capable of in other events and will surely bounce back.

Tabitha Lau also finished on one and half, but played a slightly easier field. This was won by Jiapeng Li with 6.5/7. Her individual game with the improving Nicole Tsoi was the decider, with Li emerging victorious. Tsoi won all her other games to finish second. Tung Ka Wong finished a strong third on 5.5.

Auckland Chess Centre

This year's Auckland Chess Centre championship attracted 57 entries, over half of them juniors. The A-grade was a FIDE/NZCF rated 12-player round robin, while the B-grade was an NZCF rated swiss. The time control was the 90/30 control commonly used these days. Michael Steadman and Gino Thornton led the A-grade throughout and the tournament seemed to be decided when Steadman beat Thornton in the tenth round. However Steadman followed this up with a loss to Paul Mac-Donald, but Thornton missed his chance to tie for first by losing to Keith Ward. Ward was very much the surprise package of the tournament, finishing fourth and playing way above his 1595 NZCF rating.

The B-Grade was a contest between youth and experience, with the honours going slightly the way of youth. The Maroroa family figured prominently in the final placings, with Sue finishing a clear first and younger brother Andrew equal second, both fine results in what was a very solid tournament. Dad Temu could be happy with his 50% score. Jason Wu had another good result to go with his recent wins in weekend tournaments, and Don Eade was the best of the old-stagers.

New Zealand Major Open

A moderately- sized field of 32 took part in the Major Open at the Wanganui Congress. Neil Gunn (1914) was the top seed and the only player rated over 1900. At the other end of the scale, no player was rated below 1000. The field included two Australians, Sean Watherow (back from two years ago) and Amiel Rosario. Bill Forster (+7,=3,-1) won his first national title with 8.5 points, losing only to Gunn. Local hope Prince Vetharaniam (+7,=2,-2) was second with 8, after successive losses in rounds 5 and 6. Michael Nyberg (+6,=3,-2) was third with 7.5. All three won their vital last-round games.

Grade two was taken out by Michael Wu with 6 points. Michael is only 10.5 years of age, looks like an eight -year - old, and clearly is a player of the future. The Rapid Championship drew a field of 26, with a spread of rating from 2414 down to 1270. Joint winners were Russell Dive and Tomas Civin on 7.5/9, with Dive taking the New Zealand title for the seventh time. Anthony Ker and Nic Croad were third equal on 7. Grade one was won by Michael Nyberg 5.5, with five players sharing second on 4.5-Michael Turner, Chris Burns, Prince Vetharaniam, Alan Aldridge and Andrew Stone. Grade two was jointly won by Vivian Smith, Alistair McGowan and Michael Wu on 4.5. Richard Jennings won the spot prize kindly donated by NZ Chess Supplies.

The New Zealand Lightning Championship was won by Anthony Ker. In the finals Ker won with 6 points, ahead of Bob Smith 5.5, with Russell Dive, Nic Croad and Paul Garbett sharing third with 3.5. John McDonald took out the Lightning Reserve with a picket fence of 7/7.

Player Profile: JW Sandy Maxwell by Gordon Hoskyn.

John Wayne Maxwell was born at Wellington, New Zealand, on 16th February, 1946. His family dubbed him Sandy on account of the colour of his hair, and the name stuck. Because of family shifts he attended several primary schools, but his secondary schooling was at Wellington Technical College. His first job was as an apprentice printer, but he chucked this after six months to go into security work, and just recently moved sideways to be a property custodian. Apart from his apprentice days, Sandy has not ever had an 8 to 5 job, and has never had a workday off sick. A confirmed non-smoker, his favourite drink is Orangéboom beer, and his favourite meal is the regular Sunday night family dinner. For relaxation he likes to watch DVDs, and videos. His favourite movies are "Wages of Fear" and "Shallow Grave". Overseas trips include visits to Sydney and Melbourne.

Sports Played

Sandy had six soccer seasons with Miramar Rangers. He started while still a junior and wore the number 9 centre forward, now called striker, jersey. He spent two years in the college cricket 1st XI, and afterwards played for several clubs, ending up with the Plimmerton Club. He loved opening, and was a capable left hand opening bat, scoring two century's in lower grades. He was an occasional medium pace change bowler. Memorable was the time he resumed his innings after having been hit in the face, and he scored 17 runs, and his team won the match also by 17 runs. Boyhood hero was John R. Reid the NZ cricket captain. Sandy follows with interest the progress of the Black Caps (cricket) and the Miramar Rangers (soccer) teams.

Favourite Hobby

At 12, Sandy read an account of a shark attack, and was immediately fascinated by

the subject. He is now a specialist on Great White Sharks and shark attacks. He has numerous books, tapes and scrapbooks on the subject and is planning writing his own book.

Over The Board Chess Was taught to play by a friend, at the age of 24. Soon after this he got hooked on chess when the 1972 Fischer-Spassky world title match took place. This led to him playing in the 1972-73 Wellington congress in the C grade, the one and only time he has played in an OTB tournament. A name from the congress he remembers is a very young Murray Chandler who played in the Premier Reserve. Due to working nights Sandy has never been able to belong to a chess club. His favourite player is Bobby Fischer.

Correspondence Chess A congress opponent suggested to Sandy that he take up CC so off went an entry. Memorable was winning the 1973-74 Handicap Tourney from a field of 88 players. His record was played 16, won 13, drew 1 and lost 2. His average of 6.51 points placed him first ahead of Gordon Hoskyn on 6.30. Another notable finisher was current chairman Brett Sinclair. 7th, with 5.61. Sandy played in several teams' matches for NZ and is justifiably proud of his 4-0 plus score against Australia. He nominates Michael Freeman as his toughest opponent. As a player he now regards himself as in semi-retirement. In 1978 Sandy was asked to take on the secretary treasurer role by Alan Fletcher who wished to retire. Sandy remains in the role today, and now the NZCCA has had only two CEO's in the last 45 years, a credit to both men. Sandy has worked alongside five chairmen during his tenure, and they are in chronological order Pete Mackey, the late Geof Fisher, and Bob Mitchell, Roger Chapman and Brett Sinclair. Sandy pays tribute to the outstanding service given by all five, and says they have all been a pleasure to work

The summer and holiday season are with us again so I've taken this opportunity to look back over some of the more interesting books, CDs etc that were reviewed during the last year or so.

Bashing the Sicilian

with Bb5 volume 1& 2 by Murray Chandler (Bad Bishop chess video/DVDs)

While travelling to different tournaments it's very interesting to listen to what other players have to say about various chess products, and one of the new and exciting names in chess video/DVDs that is being bandied around at the moment is 'Bad Bishop'. In this review I'll be giving the reader some background information on Bad Bishop and the advantages of their videos/DVDs. In our next review I'll be concentrating on the contents of some of their latest releases (see title above). Bad Bishop is a sister company to the excellent book publisher Gambit

(www.gambitbooks.com) owned and run by GMs Murray Chandler, John Nunn and FM Graeme Burgess. Just as Gambit is to books, the aim of Bad Bishop is to make good and user-friendly chess videos and DVDs. The advantage of chess videos/DVDs over a lot of other chess products, is that in one night the viewer is able to learn a whole new opening or defence. It's like having a personal Grandmaster, for example, teaching a powerful repertoire. In conclusion the question is not whether or not to buy a Bad Bishop video/DVD - but which one to buy!

The Colle - Koltanowski System

by Valerij Bronznik (Schachverlag Kania) Schachverlag Kania are very successful German language chess publishers who have just started to publish their books in English. Valerij's other book 'The Chigorin Defence', and Harald Keilhack's 'The Left Knight 1.Nc3', will be published in 2005. Valerij's hardback book on the Colle will change your mind if,

like many players around, you have the misguided idea that this opening is dull and boring. Right from the very first page the author inspires you that this opening can be played by many different types of players at any level. I can do no better than quote John Watson writing about this book: "Excellent treatment of the Colle".

Starting out: English

by Neil McDonald (Everyman) Everyman 'Starting out: 'series of books are aimed at players that have just started to master chess up to the medium rated players that wish to learn a new chess opening. Noted author Neil McDonald has carried on from the excellent books in this series by other well know authors e.g. Ward's (Nimzo – Indian) and Gallagher's (Kings - Indian). Neil has followed the same pattern as it precessions in that, all through the well annotatored games he has included helpful and insightful tips, warnings and notes for players wanting to take up this unrated opening. The first fact to take note about Eddie's first try as an author is the title; it's a little bit misleading as his book will be of interest not only to the players starting out to play Dragon but also to the most hardened players of this defence. Eddie's introduction to his book runs to about 15 pages which may seem long, but I find it to be quite refreshing as he writes about how and why he started to play the dragon as well as the lines and endings that he covers in the book. This book runs to 256 pages and is choked full of established and more important Eddie's own original themes, plans and theory. Chess Champions at their best by Mihail Marin (Quality Press)

the way of quality in his translation. Stefan has aimed this repertoire book mainly at players of the white pieces, but players of the black pieces aren't excluded. Olms' books are now using diverse printing styles for variations and subvariations. All in all, it certainly bodes well for easier reading.

Chess Exam and Training Guide

by Igor Khmelnitsky (I am Coach)
This book is proof that not only the big publishing houses can bring out first-rate and high-quality books. Igor has written a book here for players of all levels who wish to improve their chess game.
